INTRODUCTORY LETTER AND VITAL INFORMATION

Hello Fellow Technician,

Thanks for your interest in applying for the Tuacahn Summer Theatre Institute! This application is in regards to participating in this summer's production of *Smokey Joe's Cafe*, which will be performed in conjunction with the professional season of *Annie* and *Footloose*. We would like to formally extend this invitation to you to apply for one of the eight technical theatre internships that we offer through the TSTI.

Thanks to a great outpouring of interest from technicians, we are excited to finally expand the institute to eight select "techies." In its initial two summers, we only offered the opportunity to actors but we have found that **working hand in hand with Tuacahn technical theatre professionals will open many doors for you as well.** So why not invite eight of the best techies in the state down to spend the summer with us, building the show and building their resumes professionally? We believe in the future of technical theatre. We want to be part of creating one of the most fun and productive summers of your life.

What do I do now?

Because we are searching for the best high school talent available, we are accepting applications via email for the next two weeks. **Your application must be postmarked by March 15, 2009.**

TUITION

The Tuacahn Summer Theatre Institute is the most inexpensive summer camps in the United States for the time spent with professionals in training. The students will spend 7 weeks at the Tuacahn Center for the Arts in constant training, building, and running a professional musical production. However, because we know how hard you will be working, ***we are waiving ALL techie tuition!!!*** Tuition includes all workshops, activities, your personal trainer, camp t-shirt, one meal per day during the build period, a registration fee and **housing (if applicable)**. You could spend the summer at Tuacahn, building your resume, your skills and your circle of theatre contacts **for free.** There is a mandatory \$55 activity fee that is required for all campers and is payable once you have received your contract.

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE, HOUSING and TRANSPORTATION:

- Tuacahn is located just 10 miles West of St. George in Ivins, Utah. Because of the nature of the Summer Theatre Institute, students will be required to spend 8 – 10 hours, Mon. – Sat., in **rehearsals from June 15 – July 9**, and **performances will run July 9 – Aug 1, Monday, Thursday, Friday (matinees and evenings), Saturday (matinees and evening).**
- Some of you will need to be housed. If you can live with relatives in the area, that is always our best choice if you are under 18. However, if you are under 18 and would like to be housed in Tuacahn housing, we will need written permission from your legal guardians to house you with other students. If you are over 18, and not from the St. George area, we will be providing housing for you.
- ***You will need to provide your own transportation into Tuacahn daily.*** More information about housing will become available as soon as we know how many technicians we need to house.

Required Information for the Internships:

1. **Only students ages 15 – 19 are allowed to apply.** High School Freshmen to College Freshmen. This camp is sponsored through the educational outreach program and is meant to be an educational experience for young, up-and-coming theatre technicians that are in need of making professional theatre connections. Since some of you will be living away from home for an extended period, younger technicians are not encouraged to apply.
2. **A Picture and Resume.** A resume and a picture of yourself (headshot or school photo) *is mandatory* and will not be returned to you. Please make sure that your resume has your email address and phone number on it. We will be contacting everyone that applied through our website and constant emails until you arrive in June.
3. **An audition permission form signed by the parent or guardian.** This indicates that your parents know what you are applying for and the magnitude of the time commitment, should you be chosen. The form is at the bottom of this page and must be sent with your resume, picture and forms of recommendation.
4. **At least THREE reference letters.** One must be from your high school performing arts teacher or administrator. No parents please. They can either be formal letters of recommendation or you can simply use the “checklist form” at the bottom of this packet. (As a teacher myself, I like being able to check the boxes, its easier for me and will probably make your references very happy as well!)

A Final Note:

We are excited to have you apply for this unique experience. We want this to be a premiere opportunity for everyone in the cast and crew. The show has already been cast and you will LOVE working with these carefully selected actors. You will be directed by an award-winning educational and artistic staff, and you will get the traditional “summer stock” experience performing one of the most energetic musicals of our time, *Smokey Joe’s Café*.

Please be patient with us as we learn the best way to house your cast member during the summer. We reserve the right to change this offer until the necessary contracts have been signed at which time both Tuacahn and the cast and crew member will be locked into an agreement for the summer. Housing issues are our number one concern and will be dealt with on an individual basis.



PARENTAL CONSENT TO APPLY

(This form must accompany the application, and must be postmarked by March 15, High School Musical)

I understand that my student is auditioning for *the Tuacahn Summer Theatre Institute Technical Theatre Internships*, which will be held at the Tuacahn from June 15 to Aug 1.

- This is a professional theatre internship. There is no salary involved in this position. However, your student may be housed by us (if applicable) and we will waive their tuition for the High School Musical season. **All rights and responsibilities of the acting cast will be enjoyed by the technical staff including, supervision and mentorship by the professional technical staff at the Tuacahn Center, tickets to the Tuacahn Center season, t-shirt, meals (lunches during the build), all outings and socials and much, much more!**
- I understand that since if we are not from St. George, or the surrounding area, that my student will have to spend 7 weeks on his/her own in housing arranged either by you or by Tuacahn (if they are 18 or under).
- I understand that if my student is under 18 years of age I will need to give formal consent for my student to live in Tuacahn housing OR find a host family and that I must make those housing arrangements myself.
- I understand that, should my student be cast on the crew of *Smokey Joe's Cafe*, they will have to participate in three weeks of intense building, all runs and all performances of the show because it is being offered as one of the Tuacahn Centers regular summer production offerings. (Production costs run as high as \$75,000!) I will not be allowed to pull my student off the crew unless a formal meeting is held with the producers of the Tuacahn Center for the Arts.
- I understand that my student will have to provide their transportation in and out of Tuacahn for rehearsals and performances. (Car pools can be arranged).
